




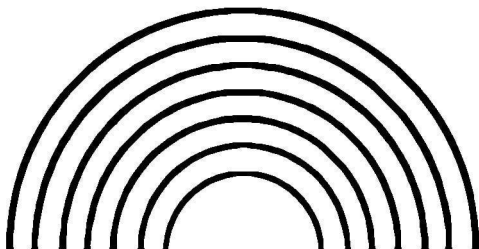

These suffixes help us to compare</p>  <p>How many more can you think of.? Can you say them in a sentence ? Can you spell them?</p>	<p>Can you learn your home address and postcode.? Practise saying it and writing it.</p> 	<p>There are some interesting tricky words in the story <i>havoc dire wreckage</i></p> <p>Find out what they mean. Can you write a sentence for each one?</p>	<p>In the story George takes the dragon to a safe place. Make a model of safe unseen overlooked wilderness for dragons to live in.</p> 	<p>Some people think that George made up the dragons</p> <p>Why might he make them up? Why might he say the dragons did naughty things? Why might he send them away?</p> 
<p>Make a poster to help children learn to read and spell the number words to ten or number words to twenty Number words to one hundred</p>	<p>Write out and practise the x tables and ÷ tables for 2 5 and 10 Or Write and practise the number pairs that add for 10 and 20</p>	<p>Collect 8, 12 or 20 objects and show a grown up how to half and quarter the collection . Explain how many equal groups you need for halves and for quarters.</p>	<p>Instructions use bossy verbs to tell people what to do. Write some instructions (eg brushing your teeth or making a sandwich) using bossy verbs. A grown up can do the writing if you tell them the instructions.</p>	<p>In the story Geogre makes a machine to take the dragons to their new home. Can you design a machine—maybe a snack machine for when you are hungry or a flying machine...</p>	<p>Evaluate your island model. What went well? What could you improve? What could you add? What might you do differently next time.</p>
