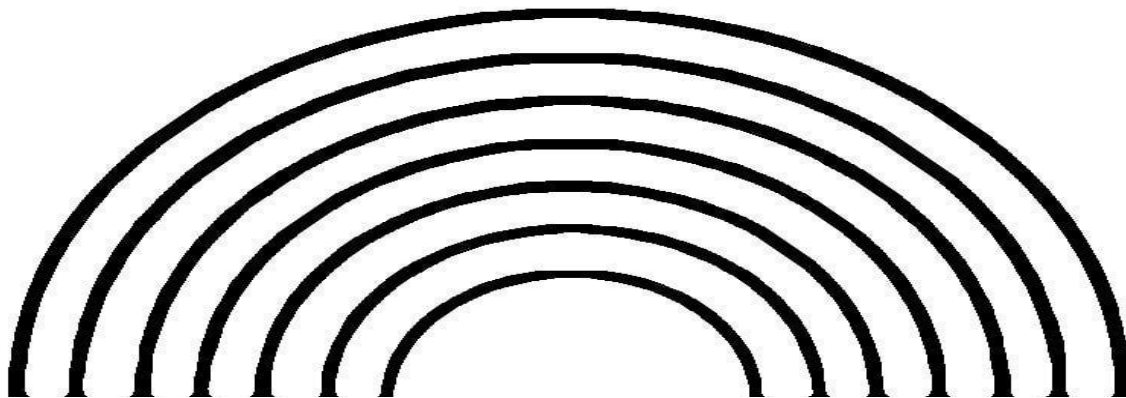


Year One and Two Homework Term 5 - A Work of Art

In PSHE this term we are thinking about how we keep safe and the people who help us. Choose one of these people draw them and write about how they keep you safe.	Draw one person dressed for hot weather and another kitted out for cold weather. Explain your reasons. Why you have dressed them like you have?	Can you make up your own subtraction word problems. E.g. the tree had 42 apples on it, 17 fell off, how many were left? Can you answer them too?	Look around your local area for sculptures. What are they? How are they different from drawings? Make a sculpture of your own using any choice of materials. Describe how you made it to the class.	Draw or paint a portrait of a relative. Write sentences to describe the person's features.	What makes someone a good team player? Write about how we might feel when winning and losing and how we can try to be part of a team.
Find out 3 facts about an artist of your choice. It could be an artist from the UK or an artist from another country.	Fractions. Practise finding half or quarter of amounts using smarties or grapes (or any item of your choice) What is half of 8? What is quarter of 8? What is half of 12? What is quarter of 12? What is two quarters of 12? What is three quarters of 12? Write down some fraction facts. Yr 2 Challenge: What is a third of 9? What is two thirds of 9?	In RE this term we are learning about Islam. We will be thinking about special places. Do you have a special place. Can you draw and describe it? It does not have to be religious just special to you.	Think of a two digit number. How many different ways can you make your number, using addition or subtraction, multiplication or division. Use objects or drawings to help you if you need to.	Create your own representation of a famous piece of art work. What is the artwork called and who was the original artist?	Write one thing you liked about your piece of art work and one thing you would do differently next time.
